Project Impact





Livelihood opportunities are created and facilitated for Armenians forcibly displaced from Artsakh enabling them to become self-reliant and economically secure in their efforts of building a new and dignified life in Armenia.

Project Objective





At least 55 forcibly displaced Armenians from Artsakh, currently residing in remote bordering regions of Armenia, are empowered to achieve self-reliance through engagement in income-generating activities, supported by the provision of necessary tools, equipment and resources.

Progress on activities





6 persons from Gegharkunik region were distributed necessary equipment for further self activity, such as: electrical instruments, sewing machine, gardening tools, etc.

5 person from Syunik region get welding machine, decorative backdrops and some tools and equipment for manicure.

Currently, visits and researches are in progress, and the list of beneficiaries is updating.

Aragats moved to Armenia from the village of Poghosagomer in the Martakert region. Now his occupation is in the village of Geghamavan that includes repairing household appliances, gardening tools, and constructing equipment for locals.






Ruzanna Mirzoyan (Vardenis, Gegharkunik)

The family lived in the city of Stepanakert in Artsakh. Hovsep was a Contract serviceman while also engaging in private construction and renovation initiatives. Hovsep continues to work on renovating private houses and apartments in the area.

Davit Ghukasyan (Kajaran, Syunik)







Davit's family is from Artsakh, and now they live in Kajaran. In Artsakh they were involved in agricultural work, but Davit has skills of welder. So, he prefers to get necessary tools to continue his job in Kajaran, Syunik region. Now he has a big hammer, set of metal brushes, electrical grinding instruments (big and small) and a professional welding machine.
